

Dear Friends,

I will never forget the sound and the shaking that woke me up on the 17th of January in our Motherhouse in Northridge. It sounded like hearing thousands of windows and glass-ware crashing.



I ran to meet our Sisters in the narrow corridor, our safest place in time of an earthquake. "Where are you, Sister Maria, Sister Annette," I called and soon they came running. More quakes followed. For me it felt like sitting on a wild bronco waiting to be thrown off its back, except I knew that above us were not the blue skies, but the house. (Continued on back page) "Lord save us, blessed Mother be with us," we prayed out loudly. Later on we explored what happened. The hallway was filled with broken pieces of glass mixed with dirt from the flower-pots. Cold wind blew in through the large broken windows of the living room, debris everywhere, yet on the cracked wall the picture of the Sacred Heart hung solidly. We almost heard Jesus saying: "Do not be afraid, I am with you." My room was turned upside down, the only object "in place" was our Lady's porcelain statue on a shelf otherwise emptied by the quake. We knew she was interceding for us.



Our Chapel was badly damaged, the marble altar and tabernacle, Ed Connolly's art-work, was thrown to the ground and cracked, the large window broken. We could not go into the kitchen, the contents of the fridge and freezer mixed with the items from all our cabinets filled the floor.

We tried to call our Sisters, the lines were dead. We heard on the radio that we were in the epicenter. "If we have survived here, our Sisters living further away must be all right," we consoled each other. As the quakes continued we asked the Holy Spirit to still the earth and prayed for our relatives, friends and for our Sisters by name. When the sun came up we went outdoors, the roof was badly damaged. We sat in the car, ate, then prayed our breviary prayers.

I don't even try to describe our joy when around 9 a.m. we saw Sister Jane, -who was on her yearly visitation in our Rimpau Convent,- accompanied by Sister Agnes stepping out of a car! Very soon our Sisters from Solvang and LA. joined us in cleaning and making the house somewhat livable.



Please pray for the gift of patience for us. It is not easy to do our regular work while workers come and go, the walls are being reinforced, the roof and the garage entirely re-done and the heater is off. This is a "built in" Lenten sacrifice, yet the joy of the Spirit is within us and we continue to give thanks to God for saving us and we pray for all of you with great love, In Jesus.
