Among the 34 participants were bishops, priests, religious, professors and workers from 7 archdioceses of the U.S. In Taiwan, our Sisters welcomed them! By personally experiencing national traditions, cultural and religious customs, all will better understand and appreciate the challenges that Asian Catholics face in the U.S. The Los Angeles archdiocese has the highest concentration of Asian Pacific population in the United States and conversion to Catholicism is increasing.
