same wonder as Mary did? Can we accept God's word as a special gift to us, or do we just let the words pass by our ears? He is alive! He is present to us at all times.







"WE MET SISTER IDA IN THE HOLY LAND!"



Several months after our pilgrimage, we received another sign of God's favor and blessing. A Hungarian pilgrim group returned from the Holy Land, and they sent the photo above to our Sisters in Budapest with a note: "We met Sister Ida in the Holy Land!" The photo shows items on the altar of the tiny church in the town of Naim, where Jesus restored life to the son of a widow.

When we were there in June, our Sisters spent an hour of prayer in this chapel where Mass is offered only once a year in what is now a predominantly Muslim town. We had discreetly placed Sister Ida's picture and holy cards under the altar cover, asking her intercession for the people there. Other pilgrims must have rearranged the items on the altar, so now Sister Ida is greeting all pilgrims with a smile. As evidenced by the cards, candles and notes around her picture, other pilgrims have joined us in prayer for her intercession!
